The Evolution of Fuel and Emission Control Systems

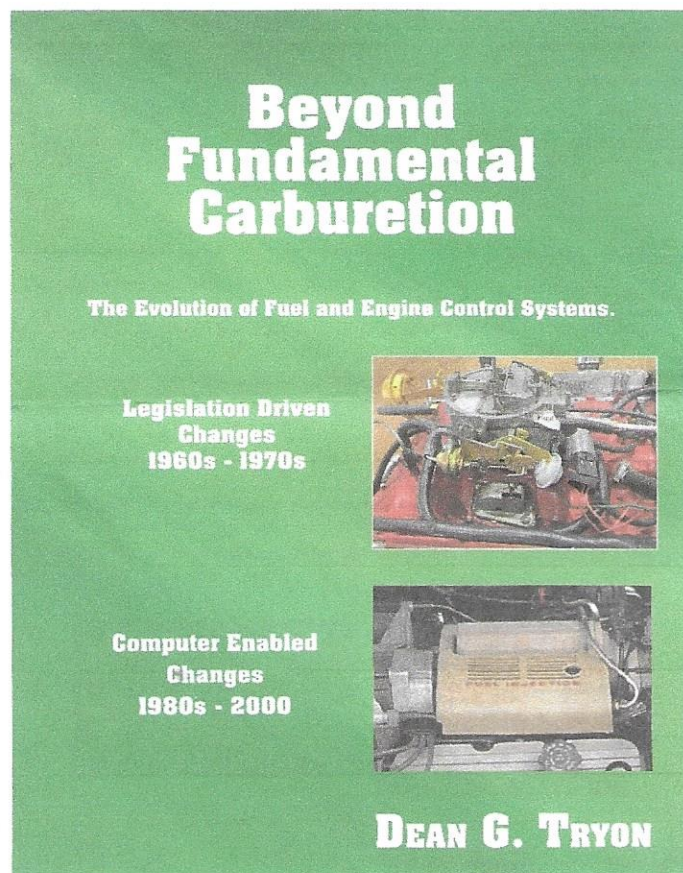

Legislation Driven changes in fuel and emission control systems from the 1960s to 1970s. Included is positive crankcase ventilation (PCV), exhaust gas recirculation (EGR), as well as evaporative loss and open loop catalytic converter systems.

Computer Enabled changes began in 1978. The computer controlled functions include fuel injection systems, closed loop fuel control, advanced exhaust gas recirculation as well as sophisticated sensors.
